1 **Welcome & Administrative**

2 Fassett called the meeting to order at 9:02 Mountain Time and Smith read through the participant list.

3 **Elwood Reservoir Recharge**

4 Farnsworth discussed the agreement amendment for Elwood Reservoir recharge. Walters asked if this can
5 be credited to the Program's water objective. Farnsworth said this is the amount of water that would be
6 diverted on behalf of the Program, most of that water recharges into the ground. There is a recommended
7 score of 2,800 acre-feet for this project. La asked how we approved the scoring mechanism, she was
8 thinking it was an annual cap instead of a single score. Farnsworth said that is how it was approved by the
9 GC, but the GC asked the EDO to go back and work with the Nebraska DNR on the associated modeling.
10 Drain said the Scoring Subcommittee recommended a score based upon an assumption of capacity being
11 made available and then utilizing the graph with that assumed capacity. The GC could elect to re-score in
12 the future based on that graph and a different assumed capacity. Fassett said the contract in front of the GC
13 today is not related to score, it is related to the amount of water that is diverted.

15 **GC Decision – Berryman moved to approve the Elwood Reservoir Recharge agreement amendment; LaBonde seconded. CNPPID (Drain) abstained from voting. CPNRD (Czaplewski) abstained from voting. Agreement amendment approved.**

16 **Permitting**

17 Farnsworth discussed the proposed sole source agreement with HDR for permitting services for the PRRIP.

18 **GC Decision – LaBonde moved to approve the HDR sole source contract for Permitting Services; Ament seconded. Sole source agreement approved.**

19 **Prescribed Fire Management**

20 Farnsworth discussed the proposed sole source agreement with CHOLETA for prescribed fire management
21 services for the PRRIP in 2018 only. The EDO intends to issue a new multi-year RFP in 2020 for prescribed
22 fire management services.

23 **GC Decision – Ament moved to approve the CHOLETA sole source contract for Prescribed Fire Management Services in 2018, Czaplewski seconded. Sole source agreement approved.**

24 **Public Comment**

25 Fassett asked for public comment. None offered.

26 **Executive Session**

27 **Ament moved to enter Executive Session; LaBonde seconded. GC entered Executive Session at 9:22 AM Mountain Time.**

28 **Taddicken moved to end Executive Session; Beardsley seconded. GC ended Executive Session at 9:29 AM Mountain Time.**

29 **PRRIP Executive Session Motions**

30 **GC Decision – Strauch moved to grant an easement deed with the City of Bayard associated with Tract W201601; Czaplewski seconded. Easement deed approved.**

31 **GC Decision – LaBonde moved to approve sale of Tract W201601 for the purchase price of \$278,000; Ament seconded. Sale approved.**



50 **PRRIP FY19 Budget and Work Plan**

51 Farnsworth, Smith, and EDO staff discussed the draft FY19 PRRIP budget spreadsheet and work plan.

53 • Czaplewski asked about WP-1(b) for phragmites control. The Program hosted a site visit in September
54 after the GC meeting, he wondered if this item should be increased back to \$300,000 as in previous
55 years because other funding sources are tenuous at this time. Walters said the proposed funding level
56 is bare-bones and would also support moving the number higher. Rabbe said the Service would support
57 moving the number higher. LaBonde said it is a good program but the amount of funding the PRRIP
58 has put into this far outweighs the benefits and it is more of a Nebraska problem that should be covered
59 more by the entities in Nebraska that benefit from the Program. He does not support moving the number
60 higher.

61 • Drain asked about the qualifying statement at the top of the budget spreadsheet. Farnsworth said that is
62 just an acknowledgement that the out-year budgets show higher expenditures than appropriations until
63 the GC makes decisions on which WAP projects to actually implement.

64 • Barels asked why LP-2 is \$2M in FY19. Farnsworth said it has \$1.8M built in for a Clark Island OCSW
65 site, that relates to whether or not the GC decides to move forward with the Lakeside slurry wall project.

66 • Walters asked if the GC would consider bumping phragmites control money from \$200,000 to \$300,000
67 for FY19. LaBonde said the phragmites issue is problematic for a set of beneficiaries in Nebraska that
68 includes Program contributors but the Program should not pay over half of the phragmites control costs.
69 It might be good to give the GC a refresher on these costs at the December GC meeting. The Program
70 should pay its fair share but the other Nebraska beneficiaries should pay their fair share as well. Walters
71 said he could present the numbers if needed, the Program pays about 42-44% of the control costs. If
72 the Program could agree to \$250,000 that would be helpful, too. LaBonde said he would like to see the
73 contribution breakdown again, he wants to know if all the NRDs and the Service are contributing.
74 Thabault said Partner programs currently put their money in other places on the river. He does not want
75 to have a stranded investment if we reduce the contributions and phragmites starts to take over again.
76 Walters agreed to have updated contribution numbers for the December GC meeting.
